We were called out to search for a 4 year old and he walked in just as the Bloodhound arrived. Again, we were called out to search, this time for a 16 year old. It turned out that he was mad and was hiding from the rest of his group. That one was cancelled while we were rolling. The next one was a report of a man with a possible heart attack just below Mt. San Jacinto. We sent an advanced team with our portable oxygen unit. They got there in record time. It turned out he had eaten some plants that were mildly poisonous and had been violently sick. He was all right when the team arrived. However, there was another fellow in the party who had pulled a groin muscle. He started out under his own power and injured it again. We had to put him in the litter and bring him out.
